Full-Time LPN Program

This is a 12 month, full-time LPN program. The program is divided into three separate levels. Level 1 will consist of 380 class hours and 200 clinical hours. Level 2 has 200 class hours and 200 clinical hours. Level 3 consists of 120 class hours and 430 clinical hours. Upon graduation you will be eligible to take the NCLEX PN exam. Classes are held Monday to Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and clinical days are 6:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. This class will start on September 4th, 2018 and conclude in early August 2019. WE are a Middle States Accreditation candidates, but we do not currently have traditional Title IV financial aid. We do have financial aid through Meritize-please see our website for more information.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Completed school application.
- The total tuition for the program is \$19,500. This includes a non-refundable seat placement fee of \$500 which is due before the first day of class. The remaining \$19,000 is due before the first day of class unless an agreement has been made between yourself and the school.
 - The total \$19,000 tuition includes your criminal record check, textbooks, uniforms, CPR certification, skills pack, ATI exams, laptop computer, graduation costs and an NCLEX review exam. There are no hidden fees or monies due after tuition is paid.
- PA Criminal History Record Information (CHRI) Report
 - This will be completed by The Rapha School, LLC.
- Physical exam performed no more than a year prior to application. This exam must include:
 - Evidence of being free of any communicable diseases and ability to lift 50 lbs
 - Evidence of a negative 2-step Mantoux or negative QuantiFeron®-TB Gold. The second Mantoux must be administered between 7-12 days of the first test.
- Evidence of a high school diploma or GED
- ATI Teas Scores: no cut score is set, scores are individually evaluated by the admission committee.
 - We will proctor your exam if you have not already taken this
- CPR Certification
- Two letters of recommendation
- The candidate will need basic math, reading, and writing skills in English. If you have EFL you will need to take a TOEFL, scores will be evaluated by the admissions committee, but generally a 50 on this exam is recommended.
